Trailhead Park Plans

Since the opening of the Middlesex Greenway in 2012 users have parked on a small gravel lot or on the lawn at the Trailhead on Middlesex Ave. Over the years there have been concept plans for a new park on the site. Last year the County hired a firm called Arterial to finalize the design for the park. They are the same firm designing Peterson Park in downtown Metuchen.

The County and Metuchen are working on what will be in the park, which may include some railroad history elements. New entrances and parking areas, and landscaping are also being planned. There is no timetable on the final design or construction. Prior to it being used for the Middlesex Greenway, the Trailhead was a parking lot for the Celotex plant across the street, and earlier it was a lumber yard that burned down in the 1940s. The property was cleaned up in the early 2000's and the asbestos dump at the rear was covered with a clay cap. Currently the Greenway ends next to the Trailhead, and when the Greenway is extended to the northwest the park will be a mid-way point on a much longer trail.

ECO-TOURS of Edison 30th Anniversary! 1995-2025!

In the winter of 1995, Walter Stochel, Bob Takash of the Edison Greenways Group, Bob Spiegel of the Edison Wetlands Association, and Bob Harsell of the Arthur Kill Watershed Association created a series of hikes to highlight land that could be preserved as conservation areas in Edison. A list of these sites was presented to the Edison Planning Board in January 1995 as draft conservation plan, for the update of the Edison Master plan. Noticing a world-wide environmental travel trend, we called these hike "Eco-Tours"

The first tour was held on a snowy wet February 26, 1995 on the newly preserved northern portion of the Dismal Swamp.



Those spring 1995 Eco-Tours were so successful it was decided to continue them in the fall, and then every year since.

Thousands of people have joined us in exploring many interesting areas of Edison. From the Stevens Preserve to the Raritan River we walked through woods, swamps, up hills, and down in ravines. We even had environmental experts leading us. Along the way, hundreds of acres of land were preserved. This year we will be doing some of these "Classic 1995" tours. See page 2 for the spring list. The Middlesex Greenway Coalition wrote a letter of support to the Borough of Metuchen supporting County acquisition of a lot on Lodi Ave. that borders the Greenway.

This would connect the Greenway to trails along the Mill Brook and Myrtle Park to the south.

During the past decade there have been "diversions" of the Greenway by PSEG, and Enbridge, which required purchasing additional land for the Greenway. This would be a perfect use of these funds.
